Tenure-track/Assistant Professor in Latinx History

The Oklahoma State University Department of History invites applications for a tenure-track Assistant Professor specializing in Latinx History beginning in August 2022. This position potentially contributes to a college-wide cluster hire initiative focusing on Inequality. Candidates in all subfields are encouraged to apply, including scholars who work on topics related to migration, diaspora, and race. Interdisciplinary approaches especially welcome. PhD is required at the time of employment. Applicants should have strong potential for achievement in scholarship, undergraduate and graduate teaching, and intellectual leadership.

Minimum Qualifications: PhD at time of employment.

Responsibilities include carrying on a program of research, teaching undergraduate and graduate courses in Latinx history, as well as lower-division U.S. surveys, upper-division courses, and graduate seminars in the area of specialization. The teaching load is 2-2. Candidates are expected to support the learning needs of students from diverse backgrounds, integrate multicultural experiences into instructional methods, and engage communities across and beyond OSU. Duties include contributing to the undergraduate and graduate curriculum, mentoring students, and contributing to departmental and university governance.

Conference travel funding and research/project support is available. Submit cover letter, CV, graduate transcripts, and three letters of recommendation to <https://apply.interfolio.com/94252> . To receive full consideration, complete applications should be received by November 1, 2021. Candidates may be requested to supply additional materials. Salary competitive.
