The application cycle is now open for the 2022-23 [USC Berggruen Fellowship](#), a partnership between the [Center on Science, Technology and Public Life](#) at USC and the [Berggruen Institute](#). Fellows drawn from a range of academic and professional disciplines will work collaboratively on understanding, anticipating, and addressing major shifts in the world's fundamental systems. USC Berggruen Fellows can be either academics or non-academics (for whom the fellowship may serve as a retreat from work in industry, government, or the arts) but above all must be committed to intellectual work of the highest quality. Applicants should have a terminal degree or commensurate research expertise in the appropriate field of study. Accepted fellows based outside of Los Angeles will receive financial support for housing and relocation for the fellowship term, in addition to research and living stipends.

All applications must include a full curriculum vitae, project statement (up to 750 words), two reference letters, and a writing sample. All materials must be uploaded via the [USC application portal](#).

The application deadline is **January 10, 2022**.
